Dr. Volodymyr Dubovyk is an Associate Professor, Department of International Relations and Director of the Center for International Studies, Odessa I. I. Mechnikov National University (Ukraine). V. Dubovyk has conducted research at the Kennan Institute, Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars (1997, 2006-2007), at the Center for International and Security Studies at the University of Maryland (2002), taught at the University of Washington (Seattle) in 2013 and at St. Edwards university/University of Texas (Austin) in 2016-17. He is the co-author of “Ukraine and European Security” (Macmillan, 1999) and has published numerous articles on US-Ukraine relations, regional and international security, and Ukraine’s foreign policy. Areas of expertise: Ukraine, Transatlantic Relations, U.S., Black Sea security.



Dr. Yevgeniya Gaber is currently working as a Second Secretary of political section at the Embassy of Ukraine in Turkey. She is also contributing to the activities of the Diplomatic Academy at the MFA of Ukraine as a visiting lecturer. She holds a M.A. in IR from Odessa National University (2007) and a Ph.D. in Political Studies from Kyiv National T. Shevchenko University (2014). Her previous working experience includes teaching at the International Relations Department of Odessa National University, and her research interests cover issues of the Black Sea regional security, with a focus on Turkish and Ukrainian national foreign and security strategies. She is an author of more than 30 articles on the related topics, and has co-authored several collective monographs. Dr. Gaber has been a participant in a number of international programs focused on security studies, peace research, Black Sea regional politics and Turkish foreign policy, including those of PRIO Institute (Norway), International Centre for Black Sea Studies (Greece), Diplomatic Academy and Vienna University (Austria), UIK International Relations Council (Turkey), SETA Foundation (U.S.). She has been a 2012-2013 Black Sea Young Reformers Fellow and a contributor to the Foreign Policy and Security Module of the NATO Professional Development Programme for Ukrainian civil servants (2017).



Dr. Sergii V. Glebov is Dean of the School of International Relations at the Institute of Social Sciences, Associate Professor at the Department of International Relations, and Leading Research Fellow at the Center for International Studies (<http://cis-onu.com/>), Odessa Mechnikov National University (ONU). He received his Ph.D. in June 2002 for his thesis entitled: “Constructing Security and Cooperation System in the Black Sea Region and the Role of Ukraine in this Process (1990ies).“ His research and teaching interests are in the field of the foreign and security policy of Ukraine, international relations in the Black Sea-Caspian region, European and Euro-Atlantic security, foreign policy of Russia, NATO-Ukraine, EU-Ukraine relations. Courses currently taught: Foreign Policy Systemology of the Black Sea region, Russia in Global and Regional Politics, Contemporary History of Europe and America (1945 -), Theory of State and Law, International Law. In 2000/2001 he was a visiting scholar at the Center for European Studies, University of Exeter (Exeter, UK) and at Columbia University, Harriman Institute (New-York City, USA) in 2003. He received several individual and institutional fellowships, including from HESP/AFP Open Society Institute (Budapest, Hungary), Carnegie Foundation and Jean Monnet Program. He has been involved into several TEMPUS/Erasmus+/Horizon 2020 Projects in the sphere of Higher education and research.

He wrote more than 60 scientific works which were published in national and international editions; speaker and presenter in numerous scientific events in Europe and USA.



Amb. Dr. Sergiy Korsunsky serves as Director of the Diplomatic Academy of Ukraine since October, 2017. He holds a diplomatic rank of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary. Ambassador Korsunsky’s previous positions include: Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Ukraine to the Republic of Turkey (2008-2016), Director-General of the Economic Department, Ukrainian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2006-2008); Minister-Counselor and Acting Ambassador at the Embassy of Ukraine in the USA (2000-2005); Deputy Director, Department for Economic Cooperation, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine (1999-2000); Counselor for Economy, Embassy of Ukraine in the State of Israel (1994-1998). Ambassador Korsunsky has extensive professional experience with strategic planning and development, including energy, trade and investment policy, energy security, regional security, science and technology. He holds a Doctor of Science Degree in Applied Mathematics since 1991. He is a well-known expert on geopolitics of energy. Dr. Korsunsky authored more than 200 publications, including 10 books. He had been teaching “Energy Diplomacy” at the Diplomatic Academy of Ukraine and published a textbook for this course. In 2008 he was awarded for his contribution to economic development by President of Ukraine.



Hennadiy Maksak is the head of the Foreign Policy Council “Ukrainian Prism”. He studied economics (Chernihiv state institute for economics and management), political sciences (Warsaw University, Center for East European Studies). In 2006-2015 he was the president of the Polissya Foundation for International and Regional Studies. In 2012-2014 he was a member of Steering Committee of the Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum. From 2016 he is a member of SC of Ukrainian national platform of the EaP Civil Society Forum. He is a Member of Civic Council under the Parliamentary Committee on Foreign Affairs. His fields of interest include international relations and foreign policy of Ukraine, security in the Eastern Europe, Eastern partnership policy, European and Euro-Atlantic integration of Ukraine, diplomatic service, economic diplomacy



Dr. Maryna Vorotnyuk is a coordinator of the current project from the side of Stratpol and Foreign Policy Council “Ukrainian Prism”. She is an expert working on security developments in the Black Sea region, Ukrainian and Turkish foreign policies, Southern Caucasus. She is a researcher in the Center for European Neighbourhood Studies of Central European University (Budapest). Dr. Vorotnyuk was working as a visiting lecturer at the Department of Political Sciences of Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia (2015-2017). From 2006 till 2015, she was affiliated with the Ukrainian leading think tank – National Institute for Strategic Studies. In 2006-2013 she was also a research fellow of the Center for International Studies of Odessa Mechnikov National University (2006-2013).
